You'll need to use Randall Frank's idl_tools dlm library. He has implemented sockets for IDL on unix and windows. Both client and server sockets which is the important point. IDL's SOCKET procedure only implements client sockets.

One approach would be for one program creates a listener that checks periodically for data and acts accordingly upon the data received. The other program connects to the listener and sends the commands.

If it you just have two programs, this is pretty simple. If you have many programs connecting to a server, you may want to have a "control channel" which all clients contact to initiate a connection. The server can then open up a socket for the client and send back this "data channel" socket number over the control channel which the client can then use to connect.
