Yes, you are going to have to keep track of so many things with !P.MULTI that it is not worth using it. If I were you, I'd come up with another plan. :-)

POLYFILL to erase the portion of the window you want to draw in, and PLOT commands with NOERASE=1 is probably a LOT easier to implement.
