Thanks for the reply.

Yeah, the variables are all there. Inside the function, I didn't use KEYWORD\_SET, I just check for N\_ELEMENTS, and indeed I had made a mistake when changing a variable name.

But it shouldn't have produced this "Variable is undefined: <UNDEFINED>", because \_nothing\_ should produce this error. If an undefined variable is invoked, the error returns the name of the variable. If a \$v is defined, then Expr(\$v) should be defined also, except in specific cases that have their own errors (e.g. non-existent structure tags, pointer stuff).

And whatever was the case, why didn't I get any traceback?

When you code by trial and error, as I do, errors that don't include traceback can exact a cost in pulled hair.
