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Hi Ryan,

I'm not sure I understand what you're trying to do - if you simply want multiple commands to be executed in the same UNIX shell, you can simply separate them with semicolons such as
mystring='ls; echo Hoorah! A listing!'

spawn,mystring

Similarly, in a bash environment, you could do

mystring='foreach f in 1 2 3; do echo \$f; done'

and spawn it. I'm sure you can derive the csh syntax from here.
