> in Unix:
> \$ setenv FOO "bar"
> \$ echo \$FOO
> bar
> \$ setenv FOO "foo:\$FOO"
> \$ echo \$FOO
> foo:bar
>
> So, how can you add to an existing env. variable in IDL with the SETENV
> command?

IDL> setenv,'FOO=bar'
IDL> setenv,'FOO=foo:'+getenv('FOO')
IDL> print,getenv('FOO')
foo:bar
