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JD Smith writes:

- > The only other ingredient is turning off XManager's default catch
- > mechanism, and using MESSAGE to throw an error instead of RETALL.
- > It's not elegant, but it does the job.

I've been trying to follow this, but I confess, I am confused. Why is RETALL needed at all? I've never used anything but RETURN in event handler CATCH statements, and I have never had any problem running programs both from the command line and from the VM.

What usually screws people up is calling pop-up dialogs from their widget programs that rely on blocking behavior, rather than modal behavior. But that doesn't seem to be the issue here.

In fact, I can't really tell WHAT the issue is here.
I'm in need of enlightenment. :-(
