> OK, I added the JDK to my PATH and the commands now work
> from the command window. When I examine the contents of
> my TryGeometry jar file, I get this:

> I don't know WHY the tryGeometry here starts with a lowercase
> t instead of the UPPERCASE T I've used every other damn place,
> but that apparently is the problem! Now I can successfully
> create my object in IDL!

The tryGeometry directory in your jar file should correspond to the package declaration in your java files. I'm not familiar with NetBeans, but it may have automatically added the package line for you when you created a new Java file. By convention package names in Java begin with a lowercase letter so the IDE may have lowercased the package name without you noticing.

Since we're already on the topic, I'd like to take this moment to give a plug for Eclipse -- the best Java IDE out there. :-)
