The short answer is, you don't.:-)

You might try making your PostScript file an encapsulated PostScript file:

Set Plot, 'PS' Device, /Encapsulated

That will allow you to resize it in the software you are using to write your paper. But you want to write the Figure caption in your Word (or Framemaker or whatever) software, NOT in the PS file you create in IDL.

P.S. I don't usually try to resize PostScript files in Framemaker (what I write my papers and book in). I usually make the file the correct size to begin with, then add the figure captions as part of a "graphics table" that I have created in Framemaker.
