I like icewm. You can have the windows larger than the screen by tweaking /sw/lib/X11/icewm/preferences and setting LimitSize to 0 (instead of the default 1).

icewm is installed using Fink; you can get fink from fink.sf.net. Then you'd type fink install icewm into the terminal and then you'd replace your exec command in xinitrc or .xinitrc (whichever you have setting your X11 preferences) with exec icewm.

You also get a nice little workspace bar. I map some of the window commands to keys with Quickeys.
