I like icewm. You can have the windows larger than the screen by tweaking /sw/lib/X11/icewm/preferences and setting LimitSize to 0 (instead of the default 1).

icewm is installed using Fink; you can get fink from fink.sf.net. Then you'd type `fink install icewm` into the terminal and then you'd replace your exec command in `xinitrc` or `.xinitrc` (whichever you have setting your X11 preferences) with `exec icewm`.

You also get a nice little workspace bar. I map some of the window commands to keys with Quickeys.
