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Hi all,

Is there a way of adding an environment variable, like SETENV does, but then permanent?

For windows one could make a .reg file and spawn regedit, adding something to "HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Environment".

For Linux one could add an "export" line to .bashrc or .profile or ...

One could try doing this for all the available OS's. Isn't there a more generic/uniform way of doing this? (Maybe "HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Environment" is ok for WinXP, but is it for 2000? Maybe you are using another shell on linux, so the 'export' line should be added to .kshrc,...)
