## Matt writes:

- > Question can IDL create a plain text file of a filelist following
- > user specifications? By this I mean that I'd like a text file listing
- > files in a directory, but would like to enclose file names in quotes
- > and add additional text to it. I imagine that this can be done by
- > calling a PERL script but I'm wondering if IDL can do it internally.

Well, suppose you obtained your file list like this:

```
filelist = File_Search('*.pro')
```

Then, you could print the list out, with double quotes around each file name, like this:

```
OpenW, lun, 'output.txt', /Get_Lun
FOR j=0,N_Elements(filelist)-1 DO BEGIN
PrintF, lun, '"' + filelist[j] + '"'
ENDFOR
Free Lun, lun
```

Suppose you wanted to add the index number of the file to each filename, you could do something like this:

```
OpenW, lun, 'output.txt', /Get_Lun
FOR j=0,N_Elements(filelist)-1 DO BEGIN
PrintF, lun, '"' + filelist[j] + '"' + ' ' + $
String(j, Format='(I2.2)')
ENDFOR
Free_Lun, lun
```

You could also format your string with a FORMAT statement to the PRINTF command, similar to what I used with the STRING command, above. There is almost infinite flexibility in how this is done.
