> SPAWN, 'basic', variable

'variable' is supposed to contain whatever output your program produces - in C terms, it contains whatever was written to stdout. Your program doesn't write anything to stdout, so variable won't contain any information. If you want to retrieve the exit status, what you want is:

SPAWN, 'basic', EXIT_STATUS=variable
