- > support an /ALL option. I can't find any evidence in the list of
- > obsolete IDL features that there ever was a routine named WDEL, nor
- > that WDELETE has ever accepted a /ALL option.

PRO WDEL, ALL=all
IF Keyword_Set(all) THEN BEGIN
WHILE !D.Window GE 0 DO WDelete, !D.Window
ENDIF ELSE WDelete
END
