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Hi

We have encountered this problem with fixed and floating licenses. IDL seems to preferentially pick the floating license ahead of a fixed one. The way we get around it is to use the interactive license up (run a command line idl session) and then run your sav file on another machine. Then it will pick up that license. Then you can go back and get out of the interactive one.
Not optimal, but it works.
