I think he meant IDLDE, not IDLWAVE. Also, it's [C-c;]. Another fun one is M-;, which in Emacs 22 will move you to a comment or create a new one in an intelligent way at the current line, or (un-)comment highlighted blocks. My favorite part is that this function is called `comment-dwim', for Do What I Mean.
