> The total number of .pro files I have in my home directory, from:
>
> find ~ -name '*.pro' | sed 's/.*\///' | wc -l
>
> is 39977.
>
> The total number with unique names coming from:
>
> find ~ -name '*.pro' | sed 's/.*\///' | sort | uniq | wc -l
>
> is 5479.
```

Don't worry, this is normal on UNIX systems. In my experience debugging other people's code, it is likely you have 15 versions of the Coyote directory in your path. And God knows how many versions of the Astro library, which is older yet. :-)
