I think your listed steps are fine, I just prefer another way. I prefer to "act locally" as much as possible i.e. I do as few commands that cause the remote repo to change as possible. So I would:

- 1. Via New > Project, checkout the directory of the repo that I want to add stuff to. (I have the projects I normally use already checked out, so this normally only happens when a project is starting.)
- 2. Add things "normally" to this project (i.e. creating/copying files and directories via the Workbench, the file system, whatever). As new files/directories arrive in the project, right click on them and select "Team > Add to Version Control." Note that adding a directory adds everything under it.
- 3. Make sure everything works.
- 4. Commit. (Up to now all changes have been just to my local working copy. This is the only command that changes the remote repo.)
