> I can see how to create an IDL project by checking the
> files out of my Subversion repository with Subclipse,
> but I cannot see how to add files in other projects
> to the repository from within IDL.

>

> In other words, once I have files in an IDL project,
> that I checked out of my repository, I can see how
> to work with them. But from within IDL I can't see how
> to add a file to the repository. Am I missing something?
> Or is Subclipse, as a Subversion client, not as powerful
> as a client like TortoiseSNV?

The file has to be in a project that Subclipse knows about (so move it there or create it there in the first place).

Right click on the file to be added. Go to Team > Add to Version Control (it's the first item in the third "grouping" in the context menu). Note: it doesn't *really* get added until you do a "commit" (i.e the repo doesn't know about it until you commit).
