>> Eclipse RCP Patch 1 for 3.3.2 - ICU4J data update including tzdata
>> 2008c
>> Multiple tries did not succeed in a installation. Or should this NOT
>> be done?
>> I activated automatic notification of available updates, thinking it
>> would be clever to do so. Was it not? B/c now of course it keeps
>> bothering me about this update that I can't install.
>
> lisssshhhh. (That sound you hear is sort of like the Brits sucking
> air through their teeth when you've done something naughty.)
>
> Probably not a good idea to install Eclipse updates, since
> the Workbench is so delicately balanced on the Eclipse release
> current at the time of the Workbench release. (In other words,
> don't take the advice of the Workbench update service.)
>
> For what it's worth, a new version of IDL (7.0.3) will be
> available, according to ITTVIS, by the end of this month.
> Faster analyzing of code, better path handling, and updates
> to the HDF and netCDF libraries, is what I heard from them.

true for IDL of course. Good example is Windows update. How cool was
that in the beginning? And Now? I have to forbid even only the
downloading of updates (and still they do it "under the table")

otherwise even only downloaded updates can block system functions,
grrrr...
