> % Type conversion error: Unable to convert given STRING to Double.  
> % Detected at: READ\_TABLE 58 /home/ingo/idltools/read\_table.pro  
> in order to not spam the console entirely? I'd rather have the programme  
> issue one warning for the entire read process instead of one for each  
> line of the table I'm reading...  
>  
> I've been looking through the docs, but it was my impression that the  
> usage of on\_error doesn't help...

If we told you how to suppress error messages, I'm pretty sure you would be back here in five minutes wondering how to prevent crap in your input variables.

I don't think we can win on this one. Error messages do tend to disappear when you write the code correctly. And nothing focuses the mind so much as an entire screen of someone yelling at you. :-)
