I think what Reimar means is that this is *always* how things work in IDL. It would be extremely unnatural if you always had to compile files in IDL. Once compiled, IDL programs stay compiled for that IDL session, unless you specifically recompile them. You can recompile any program that changed at any time you like. Then, you will be running the *new* compiled program.
