There is no requirement for when you cancel a CATCH, except you should cancel it when you are finished with it. While CATCH is in effect, any error is re-routed to the first line after the CATCH statement. When cancelled, any error is routed to the ON_ERROR condition in effect for that program module. In a real code example, rather than cancelling the CATCH there, I would probably have had another CATCH statement to replace the one I was using for the process loop.
