It is not possible to mix PostScript output and Hershey output in the same string. You can, of course, write PostScript output in one string, and Hershey output in another string, and put both into the same PostScript file. So one could, in theory, put a Hershey sun symbol inside a plot title, for example, if you constructed it correctly. In practice, it is so onerous to get the spacing and location correct, that I don't think anyone has bothered to try it.
