Hi everyone,

I'm trying to make an MPEG / MJ2 (or other portable movie file) of some data, but apparently the IDLgrMPEG object requires an additional licence I don't have. However, looking at the IDLffMJPEG2000 object, it doesn't mention anything about needing extra licences, and seems to let me create files without throwing an error. Unfortunately, I want something I can embed in a presentation, and I'm not sure .mj2 files would be suitable - although perhaps I'm missing something simple that would let me open the resulting file in Windows media player or some such programme.

I've also had a look at the Ronn Kling's AVI2IDL, which looks great, but I suspect I'll have to hope for a DLM that gets on with IDL 7. So far, I've not had any luck trying to write an .avi file with IDL 7.0 by this method.

Otherwise, I guess I'll have to beg or steal some time on a linux box and have a play with Christian Soeller's write_mpeg. Is this my best bet?
