By default the IDL Workbench is iconized when you start ENVI+IDL. If this is the case, you can change that behavior by editing the <blah> \ITT\IDL71\idlde\idlde.ini file and removing the line that says "minimized", if I remember correctly.

If you are seeing ENVI but not Workbench at all (iconized or not), then you are using a runtime ENVI license, not a full license.

Installing ENVI after you have already installed IDL should not, as far as I recall, be an issue. Is your ENVI+IDL shortcut pointing at "<blah>\ITT\IDL71\idlde\envi idl.exe"?
