I'd say it's a bit more than that. Of course new things will come from time to time but the ultimate value of IDL is the IDL community and amount of work that has been made to built numerous useful libraries available today. In my field - solar physics - there is a suite of routines called solarsoft that integrates hundreds of necessary functions for a range of solar instruments and telescopes. I wouldn't ever trade that for nicer fonts, interactive plots or any similar cosmetics. :)

Actually, beside IDL I use only two more things in my work - Fortran/C for numerics and TecPlot/ParaView for 3D visualization (though there is also IDL based Vapor for that).
