> commands. Has anyone found a way to access the recall buffer from the
> idlde command line? If not, is there a way to access the recall buffer
> from the IDL programming environment so I could write a small program
> to implement some of the ^ functionality?

The 8.0 IDLDE has some things you might like, such as control+space for command completion (enter "widg", press control+space and a list of all matching routines will pop up; this works in the editor too). Pressing the tab key will cause the IDLDE to go through the command history and recall a matching command. There's also the command history view which shows all recent commands and allows you to drag'n'drop to the command line or double click them to immediately execute.
