I was just hoping there was a built-in method of retreiving the workspace info.

What I have decided to do is parse the org.eclipse.ui.ide.prefs file located in my C:\Documents and Settings\user\.idl\itt\idlworkbenchconfig-idl70\.settings folder for RECENT WORKSPACES which provides a list of recently used workspaces and I pick the first (most recent -i.e., currently in use) workspace.

Here's what my org.eclipse.ui.ide.prefs file looks like

Not pretty, but it works, although some of our machines have multiple org.eclipse.ui.ide.prefs files so just be be sure, I'll need to check
