- > Yes, you can put file-level comments at the beginning of the file, i.e.,
- > comments between ;+ and ;- that are not immediately next to a routine
- > header are "file-level." I generally put documentation about each
- > routine in the header right next to that routine and file-level stuff
- > about the whole file like what the "public" routines in the file are in
- > the file-level comments.

OK, I'm getting to something I can live with, but I want to move to the "rst" format. In this format, how can I put multiple line examples into the documentation? For example, something like this:

```
IDL> a = findgen(11)
IDL> MinMax, a
MinMax:  0 10
```

Also, would it be possible to put these kind of code fragments in some kind of "code" type font?
