On the Mac I don't believe there can be many reasons to keep any eps files, unless it's to be compatible with some other software and/or collaborators. I tail all my plotting procedures with a command that SPAWNS epstopdf to convert the postscript graphic to PDF and then delete the postscript. The PDF filesize is always smaller, sometimes by a huge margin, and, of course, the PDF graphic can be used in Pages, Keynote, TeXShop, Omnigraffle, etc.
