Arno F. Granados <granados> writes:

> You can explicitly specify the page location of each plot using the  
> position Keyword in the call to plot. Set the !p.multi, and then  
> use something like:  
>  
> plot,y,position=[1000,1000,6000,6000],/device

Yikes! Don't do something like this. Set *either* the !P.MULTI  
system variable *OR* position each plot with the POSITION  
keyword, but *don't* do BOTH. You will get some very  
confusing results if you do.

And by the way, if you want portable code, I wouldn't be  
doing this in DEVICE coordinates. I'd do it in NORMAL  
coordinates. Then you don't have to write special code  
for PostScript and for your display.
