Well, it is only a feature on the Unix versions of IDL. On the VMS version.

CRTRL-D moves back one character instead (LEFT ARROW behaviour). On my system CTRL-D doesn't kick you out of IDL in the middle of the command line, only if there is nothing after the IDL prompt (in the manual it says it does EOF if empty or EOL if not). It does seem a bit user-unfriendly to me (but I guess that's juts Unix:)
