This might be the best you can do these older graphics commands. They often go a little crazy at high latitudes, where the math jumbles up at the singularity of the pole. I'll be interested to see if the new IDL 8 mapping functions are any better at this.

I note that there is a seminar on this topic at the IDL user group meeting in Washington, D.C. in a couple of weeks. I'll see if I can takes some notes.
