- > that requires connection to a subversion repository you should be
- > prompted with a dialog that looks like Step 8: here

- > If you can't get to that dialog again maybe try unchecking Subversion
- > under Window->Source Control Tools, then restart the workbench, then
- > check it again.

OK, unchecking Subversion and then restarting (essential!) the Workbench worked. I then got to the connector dialog again. Hurray!

- You need to choose at least one of the available connectors in order
- > for it to work (don't cancel out or the install will be incomplete.)

> It can't hurt to just select them all to cover your bases.

Well, reading through them, it didn't seem I would need ALL of them. So, following the directions in the link, I selected SVNKit 1.3.0 pure JAVA for all OS, and JavaHL 1.6.0 for Win32 binaries. That seemed to cover my bases pretty well.

> Once you properly install the connectors then Subversive should work.

Alas, once I selected the connectors and hit the Install button, I get an error dialog telling me "The operation cannot be completed. See the details." The "details" consist of this message: "Cannot complete the install because one or more required items could not be found."

The Dialog doesn't allow me to go forward or backward (choices grayed out), so all I can do it Cancel.
