Folks,

This isn't an IDL question per se, I don't thing, but it happens when I am using IDL.

Suppose I have a PNG file named "test.png" in a directory. Suppose I created the file last week, which is reflected in the time stamp of the file.

If I run the program that creates this program today, the PNG file gets created OK, but the time stamp does NOT get updated. Even if I "refresh" the File Explorer window, it retains the date from last week. If I delete the file first, then the file is created with the proper time stamp.

This is Windows 7 with all updates running IDL 7.1. Any ideas about this?
