Look at the CHECK_MATH routine. You can call it to find what types of math errors have happened since the last time you called it.

Also, there is a system variable, !EXCEPT, that lets you specify the level of detail in your overflow error message. Robin Wilson recently had a blog post about it:

Note that CHECK_MATH and !EXCEPT interact with each other as described in the CHECK MATH documentation.
