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Thanks for replying, David. Unfortunately, I do need to use cursor, or rewrite hundreds of IDL programs in my 13-year-old library of user-authored procedures. I don't want to do that. I'd like cursor to work in IDL 8 just as it did in IDL 7.

To all the other dinosaurs out there still using cursor, as I (proudly) am, the GOOD NEWS is, I did some nosing around and figured out a workaround solution by playing with X11 preferences.

- Go into X11 Prefs, select "Windows" pane.
- Enable "Click-through Inactive Windows."

Now my IDL cursor routine works again. I'm crossing my fingers that it continues to work.

So, if anyone else has this problem, it's not something to contact ITT about. It's just the new X11 implementation in Lion that is the culprit.
