What font is that? There is no restriction on which font you use in your PostScript file when you use Coyote Graphics routines. Here is how you would make an output file using the FreeStyle Script font, if you have it installed on your machine:

cgWindow_SetDefs, PS_TT_FONT='FreeStyle Script', PS_FONT=1 cgPlot, cgDemoData(1), XTitle='Time', YTitle='Signal', /Window cgControl, Output='freesytle_example.ps'
