Unless you paid about \$25K for it, it's doubtful. :-)

- > So if I type that command at the windows command prompt, it runs fine
- > with no splash. If I put the same command in the windows 'scheduled
- > tasks' list, I come back in the morning to find the splash waiting
- > on my desktop.

I think Heinz is right. Your Windows version of IDL has a run-time license built into it, so you can run IDL run-time files without a splash screen. But, anyone else running a run-time license will have to run it on the IDL Virtual Machine (which is also installed in a typical Windows install), which ALWAYS throws up a splash screen.
