There are a lot of IDL specific issues in IDLdoc besides the comment character. If you want to give it a try, take a look at docparprofileparser\_\_define.pro., particularly the \_parseLines method. There are a couple places where you can replace ';+' and ';' with the appropriate characters for MATLAB. You will also have to change it from looking for .pro files to looking to for MATLAB's extension.
