If I understand you correctly, you can achieve what you want by adding your local directory to the environment variable IDL PATH. Include the following command in your startup file:

C shell:

setenv IDL PATH \+/your local dir:\+\$IDL DIR/lib:\+\$IDL DIR/examples

Korn shell:

IDL_PATH=\+/your_local_dir:\+\$IDL_DIR/lib:\+\$IDL_DIR/example s export IDL PATH

Any directories beneath /your local dir will be included in IDL's system variable !PATH that it uses to find routines. (The "+" means that subdirectories are included.)
