Chris, his team and I actually discussed this when they were creating FILE_GZIP/FILE_GUNZIP. > > > Note that the default one-parameter call to these routines preserves the original extension; e.g., > > > IDL> file_gzip, 'foo.txt' > IDL> \$ls > > foo.txt foo.txt.gz > > > with complimentary behavior for FILE_GUNZIP. > > > > > mp

Just to chime in, Mark's explanation is correct. By default, you shouldn't need to use the second argument. It's just like on Unix, when you do "gzip file", you don't normally supply the output filename. The second argument is really only there if you need to write the file to a different

directory, or if you *insist* on giving the gzip file a new name (which will then carry over to the uncompressed file name).

But just to be safe, I'll add a note to the documentation explaining this behavior.
