## AMS writes:

> That's what I have switched to for postscript output (and using the /overplot keyword to locate my image), although I am finding that my borders are one grid cell out from where they should be (relative to e.g. coastal outlines), so I am digging into map image to see where I have gone wrong...

I did notice this morning that you can use the POSITION keyword with cgMap\_Set. Setting the same position for your map and your image should align things perfectly.

cgMap_Set, Position=pos, ...
cgImage, Postion=pos, ...
cgMap_Continents, ...
```

Works on the graphics display and in PostScript identically. :-)
