> Negatory. In fact, I prefer EPS \_because\_ it has a bounding box, which plays very nicely with LaTeX. I haven't had a problem with IDL EPS files with latex or pdflatex. (For reference, I use PS\_START/END, ... er cgPS\_OPEN/CLOSE with /ENCAP set.) Generally speaking, journals prefer EPS, although most (all?) accept PDF as well. To hear Adobe tell it, PDF is more "advanced" than Postscript.

Yes, Adobe has a very high opinion of its software. I've recently switched to the FoxIt PDF Reader so I no longer have to deal with the Adobe Reader and all the &^\$\*#@ shortcuts it puts on my desktop when it installs itself. :-)
