To be fair, that was referring to Widgets, which can now be run in non-blocking mode (or whatever it's called), so that the command line works while your snazzy data analysis widget is on screen. It's nice to have something like Xpalette running on the side while interactively messing around with loading images.

As for your other comments, it's true that the widget behavior has changed in several cases, but v4.0.1 was less than perfect under Win95, and some changes would be welcome. I'll reserve further comments until I get the "final" v5.0 (any day now?)
