I don't know, if this helps: 7z from http://www.7-zip.org/ has a command line version that can be used together with IDLs spawn procedure. The 7z extract command can extract files from a zip-file greater than 4 GB.

I did a test with a 0.7 GB file in a 6.6 GB zip file on my Windows PC.
