> It's probably best to start with an internet search for image thresholding. There are lots of good resources on-line already.

> As for how to choose the threshold value... well that depends on what you are trying to achieve. It's not always an easy choice. You may have to do statistical analysis on the image, or have other information from different sources which informs your decision.

cgStretch from the Coyote Library will allow you to see a histogram of your image and apply the threshold interactively. It is a good way to explore your image data and see the results of various threshold values.
