I've never used my LinkedList object for this purpose, but I have *thought* about doing so several times. Beau Leeger at RSI told me he put about 100000 items on a linked list once and it was still extremely fast. (Although probably NOT as fast as ordering a string array.)

But you might look at it. It has methods already available for re-ordering the items on the list.
