Use the X/Y/Z TICKFORMAT keyword, e.g.

```
IDL> plot, sin(findgen(200) * 0.1), ytickformat='(e9.2)'
```

e9.2 means 9 characters (including sign and exponent) with 2 characters after the decimal point.
